Richard Born & Guillaume Seynhaeve

Keith grew up sailing a Mobjack on the Potomac and previously sailed a Jeanneau 39i out of Solomons Island. Keith and his wife, Deborah, moved the family to Shanghai, China in 2010, where the sailing scene revolved around dinghies on nearby Dianshan Lake and occasional races in Hong Kong. *Lucky Eights* reflects this time in China - where the number 8 or "Bā" is considered auspicious. Keith now races *Lucky Eights* regularly on the Chesapeake including the Race to Oxford, the Race to Solomons, the Miles River Race, the Boomerang, and Frostbite races.


